2007 Photography Competition– Call for Entries

After a successful first year, AIA West Jersey is continuing its Photography Competition. Winning entries will be used in the AIA West Jersey 2008 Calendar that will be distributed to members and affiliates. Mounted prints of the winning entries will be sold as part of a Silent Auction during the Annual Inaugural Gala to be held in January, 2008. From the winning entries, three awards will also be presented in the Black & White and Color categories, as well as an Overall Best Entry winner.

ELIGIBILITY: Competition is open to all AIA members and affiliates, students and the general public.

CATEGORIES: Color - Black & White

AWARDS: 13 winners will be chosen for inclusion in the calendar and silent auction, in addition the following awards will be presented with cash prizes at the Annual Inaugural Gala:

- Best Overall Entry - \$ 150 prize and Calendar Cover
- First Place Color - \$ 100 prize
- First Place Black & White - \$ 100 prize

CONDITIONS OF ENTRY:

- Entry Fee is nonrefundable for up to (5) prints per entry: \$20.00 members & affiliates, \$15.00 for students, and \$35.00 non-members
- FEE and completed Entry Form MUST accompany all images entered.
- Unlimited number of entries.
- Subject must have an architectural theme or contain an element of the human-made environment. Photographic interpretation will be judged, not the architecture. Location of images is unrestricted.
- Entries must have been taken and owned by the participant.
- All entries must be submitted in both mounted print and digital format.
- Mounted prints are to be 8x10 images mounted on 11 x 14 presentation quality white mat boards, attach a sealed envelope with the following information taped to the back of each mounted print: name, address, phone number, print title, location of image or description.
- Digital images must be on CD. Photographs may be originally shot in digital format or may be high resolution scans of 35 mm (4 x 5 or 2 1/4" formats). Images should be scanned at 300 dpi (ppi) at the final output size and saved in CMYK color space as a JPG or TIFF file.
- Clearly label each digital image file and include the entrant's name, address and phone number on the front of the CD.
- Participants grant reproduction rights and permissions to AIA West Jersey to use all submitted images (in either print or electronic form) for organizational calendar, website, exhibition, publications, fundraising and promotional purposes. All mounted print entries become property of AIA West Jersey.
- Submission of entry implies acceptance of all above conditions.

AIA West Jersey is looking for as many volunteers as we can get for three hours of work on Saturday, June 9 to assist with the rehabilitation of homes for the Heart of Camden Housing. Heart of Camden, a past recipient of AIA West Jersey's Community Service Award, is a local non-profit community development corporation dedicated to the revitalization of the South Camden neighborhood known as Waterfront South.

They acquire vacant properties in severe need of repair and completely rehabilitate them for sale to low-income homeowners. They also prepare the families for homeownership through homeowner counseling, credit counseling, and assistance in qualifying for mortgages. Since 1984, over 100 houses have been completely rehabilitated, providing families with a sense of dignity and independence.

While most of the rehabilitation work is performed by professional contractors, volunteers play a vital role in preparing the houses for rehabilitation. Depending on the site where we will be working, we will be clearing the house of debris or demolishing plaster walls. Be sure to wear old clothes. Heart of Camden will provide gloves, tools, hard hats and other necessities.

We will meet at the Heart of Camden office at 1742 Ferry Avenue at 9:00 am and then proceed to the work site. Parking is available along Ferry Avenue. We will be finishing up at noon. Please join us on June 9 to make a difference in Camden.

AIA West Jersey presents a tour of Philip Johnson's Glass House

The personal home of architect Philip Johnson has been opened to the public as a museum. Join AIA West Jersey to be one of the first to tour this house and surrounding out-buildings.

Cost of trip includes round trip bus transportation from Cherry Hill, tour of Glass House and grounds, and continuing ed programs provided during bus ride.

The actual tour is 90 minutes long which includes the Glass House and outbuildings (Brick House, Painting Gallery, Sculpture Gallery and Da Monstra). It requires a 1/2 mile of walking and no photos are allowed.

When not on the scheduled tour you are free to explore the charming New England town of New Canaan. The Glass House visitors center is located in the downtown among shops and restaurants.

Tour packages has been pre-purchased and individual tours are limited to groups of 10 people each. AIA-WJ has limited spaces reserved so trip registration will be handled on a first come basis.



A final itinerary will be provided to you prior to leaving on the trip. The bus will leave Cherry Hill at 7:00 am on September 29 from the Barclay Farm Shopping Center (Rt. 70E), and arrive back in Cherry Hill at approximately 8:00 pm on September 29. Registration and payment is required by August 24, 2007.

Local architect to speak at green symposium in Washington, DC.

Stephen L. Schoch, AIA, a principal Kitchen & Associates Architectural Services, PA, of Collingswood NJ, will be a guest speaker at The National Building Museum in Washington, DC on Wednesday, May 30. The symposium, titled “Sustainable Design: New Directions for Affordable Housing” is being held to discuss and explore ideas and practices on how to address the environmental impact of affordable housing in the U.S.

Mr. Schoch will be presenting a case-study of Faison Mews, a sustainable, affordable housing project in Camden, NJ, which was completed last year. Faison Mews, a blend of both new construction and historic rehabilitation, contains 51 rental units for seniors. The project has earned the 2006 New Jersey Governor's Excellence in Housing Award for Outstanding Green/Sustainable Design.

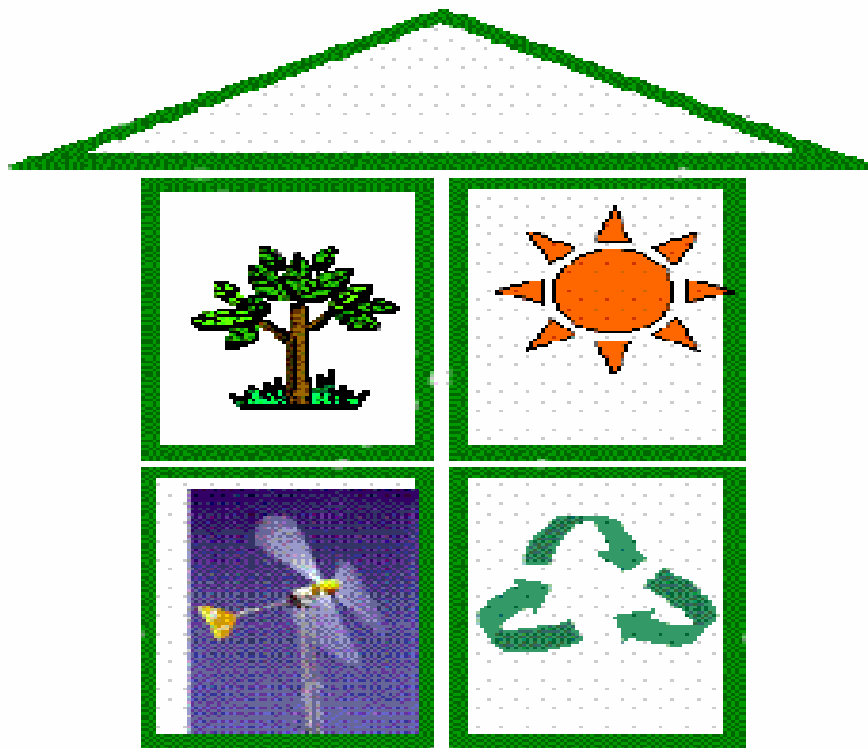

AIA Teams Up with Google to Launch New Architecture Layers in Google Earth

On April 24, the AIA launched two new layers in Google® Earth: Blueprint for America and America's Favorite Architecture. Marking the Institute's 150th anniversary, the AIA and Google Earth partnership demonstrates architecture's impact on the world to more than 200 million Google Earth users.

The America's Favorite Architecture layer features the American public's favorite structures, as selected by an independent poll of the public announced earlier this year. Google Earth users can now see many newly created 3-D models of the ballparks, bridges, buildings, and memorials that characterize architecture for Americans and comment on the poll results. By clicking on the America's Favorite Architecture layer, users can view textured 3-D images of the nation's most popular landmarks created with Google SketchUp, right down to the trees lining the sidewalks and flags flanking the entrances.

Google's intelligent drawing system

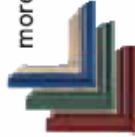
